• School Board Recognition

#### 12. Public Discussion

- Mrs. Gully noted Mine Hill students in a few activities in the month.
- Mayor Sam Morris mentioned that a corral is needed for the garbage; the town will be enforcing
  residency issues regarding "stacking" of residences in single family homes; he mentioned that he
  would be working on laws to allow Mine Hill students to come back to their home school to
  participate in sports; and he will also be working on getting monies from the state to fill the
  mines in the town.
- A question was raised regarding NJASK support for students and Mr. Zygmunt noted that there is a plan in place to work with students.
- An issue regarding residency was brought up during the public discussion and Stephen Bacigalupo, Board Attorney clarified that if a student is determined to be homeless with their last legal address being Mine Hill and then goes to another temporary residence outside of Mine Hill, Mine Hill is obligated to keep that student on-roll for 1 year. After the 1 year, the new town/city of the temporary place of residence is responsible.
- A parent questioned the make-up of snow days and could more be done to make other considerations since, plans have already been made by parents. Dr. Calabro will consider her request and work with parents on this issue.
- The soccer club thanks the board for allowing them to hang up a sign requesting students to sign up for soccer.

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2014, a plenary hearing was held before the Mine Hill Board of Education pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1 *et seq.* and N.J.A.C. 6A:22-1.1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, on that date, the adult student and/or his parent(s)/guardian(s) did not attend the hearing despite having been apprised of their right to do so, and having been further advised that the hearing would proceed in their absence; and

WHEREAS, the Board, after having heard and considered all of the proofs and testimony presented, determined that the required proof of residency in the Mine Hill School District was not provided pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:22-3.4 and N.J.A.C. 6A:22-4.3(a).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby adopts the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, on this 27<sup>th</sup> day of January, that the Board finds that Student #1830949552 has not provided the required proof of residency in the Mine Hill School District, and, therefore, is ineligible to attend the Mine Hill Public Schools/Dover Schools per a send-receive agreement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent is hereby directed to effectuate the transfer of the child forthwith, subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1(b)(2), and that written notice of this decision and the family's right to contest same before the Commissioner of Education within twenty-one (21) days shall be immediately served upon the parents; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby reserves its right to collect any and all tuition owed by the adult student and/or his parent(s)/guardian(s) for the student's period of ineligibility to attend school in the District.
