BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mine Hill Township Board of Education approves the **2015-2016** school district budget for submission as follows:

General Fund	\$9,433,735
Special Revenue Fund	\$ 176,939
Debt Service Fund	\$ 209,275
Total	\$9,819,949

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the district has a taxing authority which is composed of a 2% cap increase over the prior year which totals \$127,452 resulting in a maximum district tax levy available of \$6,500,053.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there should be raised for the General Fund a tax levy of \$6,488,053 as well as a debt service amount of \$209,275 for the ensuing School Year (2015-2016).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the unused taxing authority of \$157,082 will be banked for potential use in the subsequent three fiscal years.

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-5.2(a) mandates boards to establish annually prior to the budget preparation for public relations and each type of professional service a maximum level of spending for the ensuing school year, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the 2015-2016 school district budget includes the following maximum levels of appropriation for **professional services**:

Architecture/Engineering	\$ 10,000
Legal	\$ 14,000
Audit	\$ 21,000
Physician	\$ 3,600
For a total amount of	\$ 48,600

AND WHEREAS, the Administration needs to notify the Board of Education if there arises a need to exceed said maximums. Upon which the Board of Education may adopt a dollar increase in the maximum amount through formal Board action, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Education and the Administration wishes to minimize the amount of paperwork involved in this area,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mine Hill Township Board of Education establishes these maximums for public relations and professional development in the areas listed above at a level of 120% of the amounts listed for the 2015-2016 school year.

a. RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Business Administrator and approves the **payment of bills** (including state health and dental benefits) from the General Operating Account, in the amount of \$863,478.55 plus \$303,162.20 for the **March**, 2015 payrolls (including gross payroll amounts, district share of DCRP pension benefits, the state and district's share of FICA); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approves the payment of bills from other funds as delineated below:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education accepts the **Board Secretary and Treasurer Reports** above referenced reports and certifications subject to reconciliation of the secretary's report with the statements of cash position and reconciliation report when received, and orders that it be attached to and made part of the record of this meeting; and be it

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23-2.11(c)4, the board of Education certifies that, after review of the board secretary's and statements of cash position and reconciliation monthly financial reports (appropriation section) and upon consultation with the appropriate district officials, to the best of its knowledge, no major account or fund has been over-expended in violation of N.J.A.C. 6A:23-2.11(b), and that sufficient funds are available to meet the district's financial obligations for the remainder of the year.
