Sam Morris Question: Cost of the appeal? How much the district has spent to date? Has the district been advised if the appeal will be successful? Mine Hill seat on the Dover Board.

Answer: Estimate is \$7,000-\$10,000 for appeal. Appeal on the basis that the Commissioner looked at the wrong percentage.

Brett Coranato Question: Did the board appeal back in 2001?

Answer: The Board of Education did not appeal, it never went to court.

Mrs. Debbie Giordano Question: If the district pays tuition how is it that we lost the Dover seat?

Answer: According to statue, if the enrollment percentage drops to less than 10% district is not entitled to a seat on the Dover Board of Education.

Brett Coranato Comment: Contract should be revised to require a seat on Dover's Board

Kristine Kanzenbach Question: If the contract has expired why can't the district just walk away?

Answer: Contract cannot be terminated without Commissioner's approval.

Kristine Kanzenbach Question: Which tuition is cheaper Roxbury or Dover?

Answer: Dover's tuition is cheaper.
